For 28 years Don Green piloted the baseball program at Jefferson State Community College in Birmingham, Alabama. He compiled a 622-428 (.592) career mark in the NJCAA, which ranked him in the top 20 all-time among inactive coaches in the association when he retired in 1996. Coach Green’s teams won the Alabama Community College Conference (ACCC) North Division 10 times and twice captured the Region 22 title. He was named the North Division Coach of the Year on nine occasions and was a two-time Region 22 Coach of Year recipient.

In addition to coaching, Coach Green promoted baseball in the Alabama region, serving as president of the ACCC Baseball Committee for three years. From 1991 through 1996, he held the position of Athletic Director at Jefferson State. A native of Birmingham, he was an accomplished athlete at Jones Valley High School. He attended Florida State University and Samford University on football scholarships, lettering three years at Samford, where he earned his Bachelor of Science degree. He later earned a Master of Arts degree from the University of Alabama.
