Joey Lloyd is a 1976 graduate of Midfield High School. While at Midfield he lettered in both football and baseball. After high school he played college baseball at Jefferson State Community College. During both years at Jefferson State he played on teams that won two Alabama State JUCO championships. Coach Lloyd finished his playing career at the University of Alabama. He graduated from Alabama in 1981 with a bachelor's degree in Education. In 1994 he received his master's degree in history from the University of Montevallo.

Joey Lloyd started his coaching career at Midfield High School. During his three years at his Alma Mata, he was an assistant football and baseball coach. In 1984, he accepted a position as assistant football coach and later in 1984 was named head baseball coach at Pleasant Grove High School. Coach Lloyd served as head baseball coach from 1985 till 2007 when he retired from coaching baseball.

During Coach Lloyd's 23 year tenure, his teams won 558 and lost 291. He coached Pleasant Grove to state championships in 1993, 1994 and 1996. His teams finished as state runner ups four times. His teams won 14 area championships, 10 Jefferson County Tournament championships and made the playoff twenty times. He was honored as "Coach of the Year" nine times. Over his 23 years Coach Lloyd has been given the opportunity to coach many outstanding young men that have excelled on and off the field. Fifty of his players have gone on to play college baseball. He has also had three players to sign professional baseball contracts.

Coach Lloyd is married to De Lesia and has two daughters, Erica and Rachel.
