JONES TUBB **Class of 2002**

Jones Tubb had a great love for baseball, which began in his youth and lasted his life of 85 years. He started the Little League program in Tuscaloosa after returning home from three and a half years in Europe during World War II where he excelled as a player after the war playing on an All Star team that toured Germany, France, Italy, and England.

Coach Tubb helped coach Tuscaloosa American Legion Post 34 to a national runner-up finish in 1996 and a national title in 1967. He served as an assistant on the SEC Championship University of Alabama team that finished second in the College World Series in 1983. In 1986, he became the head coach at Shelton State Community College and concluded his baseball coaching career at age 78 at Tuscaloosa Academy. He was inducted into the Alabama Baseball Coaches Hall of Fame in 2002, which he considered a great honor.
