"In Recognition of a Lifetime of Outstanding Achievement in the game of Baseball. The State of Alabama will forever be in your debt."

Coach Lloyd Skoda has enjoyed much success during his time as head baseball coach at Faith Academy and Daphne High School. Among those successes are 13 state championships in all.

Coach Skoda has had two stints as the head baseball coach at Faith Academy in Mobile, Alabama where his teams earned 11 state titles. Skoda took over the program at Faith Academy in 1974 and served as its head coach until 1989, relinquishing head coaching duties for the 1985 season so Coach Andy Robbins could get experience calling the shots. During that time at Faith Academy, Coach Skoda's teams were 307-92.

Between time at Faith Academy, Skoda served as head baseball coach at Daphne High School from for nine seasons from 1990-1998 where his teams earned two state championships and posted a record of 251-58. Skoda returned to Faith Academy in 2000 and remained until 2013 leading his teams to a 344-115 record.

Throughout his 38 year coaching career, Skoda's teams averaged over 26 wins per year to just seven losses—a 77% career winning percentage and posted an overall record of 902-265 between the two schools.

For his efforts, Coach Skoda is in the Baldwin County Hall of Fame and Mobile Sports Hall of Fame. Skoda was named Baldwin County Coach of the Year six times and also served as president of the Baldwin County Coaches Association. The baseball field at Daphne High School bears his name in honor of Coach Skoda's success.
