## Alabama Baseball Coaches Association Scholarship Program

### Purpose

The Alabama Baseball Coaches Association (ALABCA) wants to assist student-athletes, who attend our regional workouts, All-Star Event or Team Alabama, with their college expenses during their first year of college. The scholarships are a cash value worth \$1,500 and are available for the recipient's freshman year only. The \$1,500 awards will be given in the form of a check written directly to the college the recipient attends to help cover tuition and/or the cost of books. If both of these are already paid for by another scholarship, the money will be used to help pay for the recipient's housing and/or living expenses. If this is also paid for by other award money, the ALABCA will decide how to award the money to the recipient so that it will be most beneficial to the recipient in his first year of college. The recipient may apply the scholarship only to costs associated with their college's academic expenses first or housing expenses second. Recipients may choose to use their scholarship for a college in-state or out-of-state. After the scholarship recipients have been chosen, their packets will be sent to the Scholarship Advisory Committee, where they will choose the ALABCA Student-Athlete-of-the-Year, and will award them the "Joe Mason Scholarship." The Student-Athlete of-the-Year will have an extra \$500 added to their \$1,500 scholarship, for their total scholarship to be valued at \$2,000. The ALABCA's budget will determine how many scholarships will be awarded. On an average year six are awarded.

### Who may apply for a Scholarship?

- \* Any AHSAA, AISA or Home Schooled 2022 Senior who Alabama Baseball Coaches Association's 2020 All-Star Event or played on Team Alabama.
- \* These applicants high school coaches must be a 2021 - 2022 ALABCA member. See our Membership Link on our web-site at [www.alabca.org](http://www.alabca.org). If he isn't a member when you apply he may still join.

#### A completed application consists of:

- 1) A typed completed application form.
- 2) A copy of the applicant's high school transcript.
- 3) An essay entitled "Why I should receive an ALABCA Scholarship" from the applicant.  
It must be typed and should be two pages maximum in length.
- 4) A one-page letter of recommendation from the applicant's:
  - \* High School Head Baseball Coach
  - \* High School Guidance Counselor
  - \* High School Principal/Headmaster(Letters of recommendation may be sent directly to the ALABCA by the person writing it, or they may be included in the applicants packet)
- 5) The applicant's high school coach must be a 2021 - 2022 member of the ALABCA.
- 6) Fully completed applications must be mailed in. No applications will be accepted by email.

**All applicants Completed Packets must be received by Friday, September 17, 2021**, for applicants to be considered for a scholarship. All applicants will be notified by mail that their application has been received and whether or not it is complete. Scholarship recipients will be notified by phone by the first week of November. Scholarship recipients and their parents will be honored and recognized in an on-field ceremony for their achievement during game 2 of the AHSAA 6A or 7A Championship Series. This game usually occurs the third Saturday of May (May 21, 2022 best guess for now) in Montgomery, at the Montgomery Biscuits Riverwalk Stadium. They'll also enjoy free food & drinks, sponsored by Montgomery Biscuits, while watching the game from a sky box suite provided by ALFA.

- \* If the applicant is being recruited by an NCAA Division I or II College/University he must inform the head coach of that institution that he has applied for our scholarship. If the applicant is awarded our \$2,000 or \$1,500 scholarship it would count toward the NCAA Division I 11.7 or Division II 9.0 baseball scholarship equivalency. Same in Community College in some cases.
- \* The scholarship must be used during the 2022 - 2023 school year. The scholarship becomes void should the student-athlete sign a professional contract in any sport.

## FULL QUALIFIER

College-bound student-athletes enrolling at an NCAA Division I school need to meet these academic requirements to practice, compete and receive an athletics scholarship in their first year of full-time enrollment.

- Complete 16 core courses in the appropriate areas.
  - Ten of the 16 core courses must be completed before the seventh semester (senior year) of high school.
  - Seven of the 10 core courses must be in English, math or natural/physical science.
- Earn a core-course GPA of at least 2.300.
- Earn an SAT combined score or ACT sum score matching the core-course GPA on the Division I sliding scale.
- Submit proof of graduation to the Eligibility Center.

## ACADEMIC REDSHIRT

All Division I academic redshirts may receive an athletics scholarship and practice during their first year of full-time enrollment at a Division I school, but may NOT compete.

- Complete 16 core courses in the appropriate areas.
- Earn a core-course GPA of at least 2.000.
- Earn an SAT combined score or ACT sum score matching the core-course GPA on the Division I sliding scale.
- Submit proof of graduation to the Eligibility Center.

## TEST SCORES

If a student-athlete plans to attend an NCAA Division I college or university, they should use the sliding scale to review the core-course GPA and SAT/ACT score they will need to meet Division I full qualifier standards. When registering for the SAT or ACT, students should use code **9999** to ensure their test scores are sent directly to their Eligibility Center account. More information regarding the impact of COVID-19 and test scores can be found at [on.ncaa.com/COVID19\\_Fall2022](https://on.ncaa.com/COVID19_Fall2022).

An SAT combined score is calculated by adding critical reading and math subscores. An ACT sum score is calculated by adding English, math, reading and science subscores. Students may take the SAT or ACT an unlimited number of times before they enroll full time in college. If a student takes either test more than once, the best subscores from each test are used for their academic certification process.

## CORE-COURSE LIST

Student-athletes should check to see if their high school has a list of [NCAA-approved core courses](#). No core-course list means courses taken from that high school will not count toward NCAA eligibility.

## ONLINE COURSES/ NONTRADITIONAL

Nontraditional courses are classes taught online or through distance learning, hybrid/blended, independent study, individualized instruction, correspondence or similar means.

These types of courses may be acceptable for use in the NCAA initial-eligibility certification process; however, it is important to make sure the nontraditional program has been approved and appears on the high school's list of [NCAA-approved core courses](#).

## BE AHEAD OF THE GAME

If student-athletes want to get ahead of the game, they need to register with the [NCAA Eligibility Center](#) during their freshman/9th year.

After college-bound student-athletes complete their sophomore, junior and senior years, it is important for them to ask their counselor at each high school or program they attended to upload their official transcript to their Eligibility Center account.

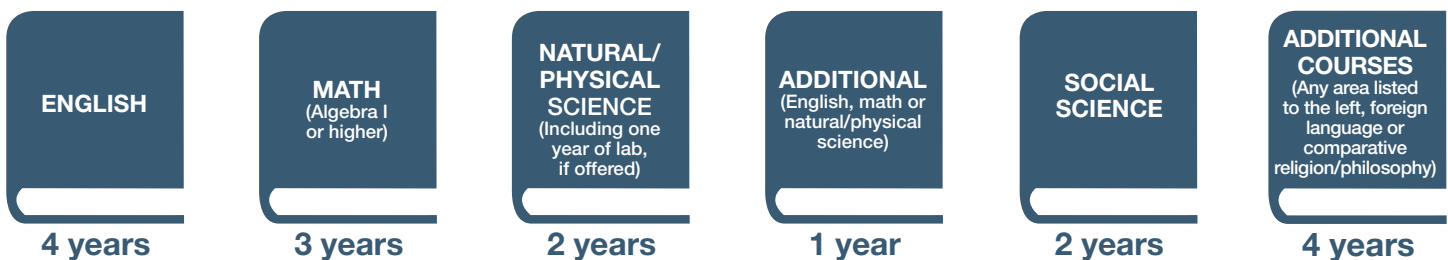

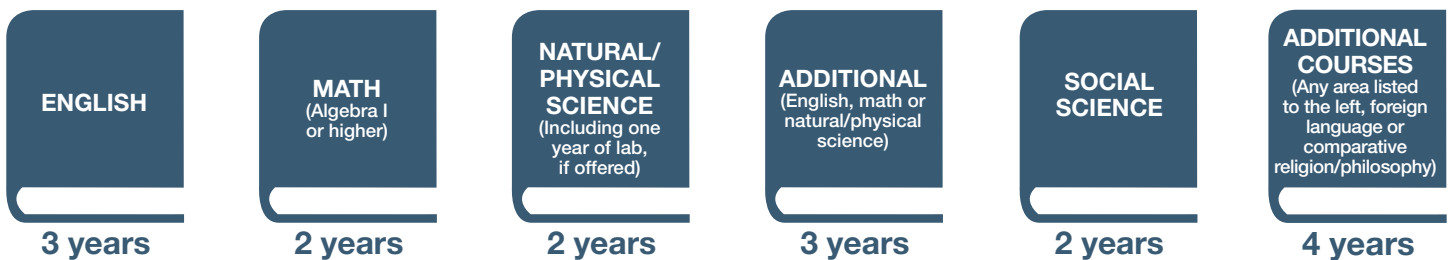

## GRADE-POINT AVERAGE

The NCAA Eligibility Center calculates your [grade-point average](#) based only on the grades you earn in NCAA-approved core courses.

## SLIDING SCALE

Divisions I and II use sliding scales to match test scores and GPAs to determine eligibility. The sliding scale balances your test score with your GPA. ## TEST SCORES

You may take the SAT or ACT an unlimited number of times before you enroll full time in college. Every time you register for the SAT or ACT, use the NCAA Eligibility Center code **9999** to send your scores directly to us from the testing agency. We accept official scores only from the SAT or ACT, and cannot use scores shown on your high school transcript. If you take either test more than once, the best subscore from different tests are used to give you the best possible score.
