MIKE GOOD **Class of 2022**

Mike Good is a graduate of the University of North Carolina-Wilmington where he was a member of the NAIA World Series team in 1975 and UNC-W's first NCAA Division I team in 1977. Using his experience as a player, Good embarked on a coaching career, now heading into his 29th season coaching high school baseball in Alabama. Good spent 23 years as the head baseball coach and Program Director at Madison Academy (2003 - 2016) and is currently an assistant baseball coach at Sparkman High School.

During his 14-year tenure at Madison Academy, Good turned in a 406 - 205 record that includes four Class 3A state championships (2009, 2014 - 2016) and two runner-up finishes (2010 - 2011). His retirement from Madison Academy came after molding the Mustang program into one of the most respected programs in the state. Madison Academy appeared in and won more playoff games than any other school in Madison County, with an astonishing playoff record of 73 - 27 and an area record of 89 - 3, capturing 14 area titles. All of his success at Madison Academy came as a volunteer coach, serving his players and school while taking no salary, using his time there to give back and share his faith as a Christian tithe and service.

While at the helm of the Mustang program, Good's teams produced 18 first-team all-state members, 21 second-team and Honorable Mention members, and 69 of his players were recognized as All-Region and All-Metro selections.

In addition to his time at Madison Academy and Sparkman, Good also established and managed the Madison Monarch Baseball Club for players 18 and under. From that program, over 170 players went on to play collegiately and 29 went on to play professionally.

Coach Good was the 2014 recipient of the prestigious ALABCA Sammy Dunn Memorial Award. This award is given annually to an AHSAA state championship coach, in any classification 1A - 7A, whose team exhibits a high level of skill and excellence on the field and exemplifies high character off the field. In 2017, he was inducted into the Huntsville/Madison County Athletic Hall of Fame.
