Tim Becker's baseball career after high school includes two years at Gulf Coast Community College followed by a stint at the University of South Alabama under Steve Kittrell where he earned second-team All-American honors. In 1986, Becker signed with the New York Yankees and played until 1990. Many of his coaching philosophies derived from legendary Yankee, Bucky Dent and former Yankees and Orioles skipper, Buck Showalter.

Following his playing career, Becker has spent 27 years as a baseball coach in the state of Alabama, 20 of those as a head coach, with stops at Theodore, Mary-Montgomery, UMS-Wright, St. Luke's Episcopal, and now at McGill-Toolen. Becker began his head coaching career at UMS-Wright, going 196 - 96 in 8 years, capturing the 1997 and 1999 state championships. At St. Luke's, Becker's teams went 132 - 40 in five years claiming the 2013 and 2014 state championships. Becker has since moved on to McGill-Toolen amassing a record of 155 - 69 and winning the 2019 7A state title.

In 20 years at the helm, Becker's teams have gone 483 - 205 and 11 of Becker's teams have reached the semi-finals or finals in the AHSAA state playoffs claiming five state championships.
