# Alabama Baseball Coaches Association Scholarship Program

## Purpose

The Alabama Baseball Coaches Association (ALABCA) wants to assist student-athletes, who attend the High School All-Star Event and our Showcases throughout the year, with their college expenses during their first year of college. The scholarships are a cash value worth \$1,500 and are available for the recipient's freshman year only. The \$1,500 awards will be given in the form of a check written directly to the college the recipient attends to help cover tuition and/or the cost of books. If both of these are already paid for by another scholarship, the money will be used to help pay for the recipient's housing and/or living expenses. If this is also paid for by other award money, the ALABCA will decide how to award the money to the recipient so that it will be most beneficial to the recipient in his first year of college. The recipient may apply the scholarship only to costs associated with their college's academic expenses first or housing expenses second. Recipients may choose to use their scholarship for a college in-state or out-of-state. After the scholarship recipients have been chosen, their packets will be sent to the Scholarship Advisory Committee, where they will choose the ALABCA Student-Athlete-of-the-Year, and will award them the "Joe Mason Scholarship." The Student-Athlete-of-the-Year will have an extra \$500 added to their \$1,500 scholarship, for their total scholarship to be valued at \$2,000. The ALABCA's budget will determine how many scholarships will be awarded. On an average year six scholarships are awarded.

## Who may apply for a Scholarship?

\* Any AHSAA, AISA or Home Schooled 2025 Senior who Alabama Baseball Coaches Association's 2024 All-Star Event or played on Team Alabama.

\* These applicants high school coaches must be a 2024 - 2025 ALABCA member. See our Membership Link on our web-site at [www.alabca.org](http://www.alabca.org). If he isn't a member when you apply he may still join.

A completed application consists of:

- 1) A typed completed application form.
- 2) A copy of the applicant's high school transcript.
- 3) An essay entitled "Why I should receive an ALABCA Scholarship" from the applicant. It must be typed and should be two pages maximum in length.
- 4) A one-page letter of recommendation from the applicant's:
  - \* High School Head Baseball Coach
  - \* High School Guidance Counselor
  - \* High School Principal / Headmaster(Letters of recommendation may be sent directly to the ALABCA by the person writing it, or they may be included in the applicants' packet)
- 5) The applicant's high school coach must be a 2022 - 2023 member of the ALABCA.
- 6) Fully completed applications must be mailed in. No applications will be accepted by email.

**All applicants Completed Packets must be received by Friday, September 15, 2024,** for applicants to be considered for a scholarship. All applicants will be notified by mail that their application has been received and whether or not it is complete. Scholarship recipients will be notified by phone by the first week of November. Scholarship recipients and their parents will be honored and recognized in an on-field ceremony for their achievement during game 2 of the AHSAA 7A Championship Series in May 2025 at Jacksonville State University. They'll also enjoy free food & drinks provided by the ALABCA, while watching the game from a suite.

\* If the applicant is being recruited by an NCAA Division I or II College / University he must inform the head coach of that institution that he has applied for our scholarship. If the applicant is awarded our \$2,000 or \$1,500 scholarship it would count toward the NCAA Division I 11.7 or Division II 9.0 baseball scholarship equivalency. Same in Community College in some cases.

\* The scholarship must be used during the 2025 - 2026 school year. The scholarship becomes void should the student-athlete sign a professional contract in any sport.

# DIVISION I ACADEMIC REQUIREMENTS

To study and compete at a **Division I school**, you must earn 16 NCAA-approved **core-course credits**, earn a minimum 2.3 **core-course GPA** and submit your final transcript with proof of graduation to the Eligibility Center.

## CORE-COURSE REQUIREMENTS

Earn 16 NCAA-approved core-course credits in the following areas:

For Division I, 10 of your 16 NCAA-approved core-course credits must be completed before the start of your seventh semester, including seven in English, math or science.

## QUALIFIER

As a Division I qualifier, you may practice, compete and receive an athletics scholarship during your first year of full-time enrollment at an NCAA Division I school.

- Earn 16 NCAA-approved core-course credits in the right areas.
  - Complete 10 of your 16 NCAA-approved core-course credits, including seven in English, math or science, before the start of the seventh semester.
  - Complete your 16 NCAA-approved core-course credits in eight academic semesters or four consecutive academic years from the start of ninth grade.
- Earn a minimum 2.3 **core-course GPA**.
- Submit your final transcript with proof of graduation to the Eligibility Center.

## ACADEMIC REDSHIRT

As a Division I academic redshirt, you may practice during your first regular academic term and receive an athletics scholarship during your first year of full-time enrollment but may NOT compete during your first year of enrollment. You must pass either eight quarter or nine semester hours to practice in the next term.

- Earn 16 NCAA-approved core-course credits in the right areas.
- Earn a minimum 2.0 core-course GPA.
- Submit your final transcript with proof of graduation to the Eligibility Center.

# DIVISION II ACADEMIC REQUIREMENTS

To study and compete at a **Division II school**, you must earn 16 NCAA-approved **core-course credits**, earn a minimum 2.2 **core-course GPA** and submit your final transcript with proof of graduation to the Eligibility Center.

## QUALIFIER

As a Division II qualifier, you may practice, compete and receive an athletics scholarship during your first year of full-time enrollment at an NCAA Division II school.

- » Earn a minimum 2.2 **core-course GPA**.
- » Submit your final transcript with proof of graduation to the Eligibility Center.

## PARTIAL QUALIFIER

If you have not met all of the Division II academic standards, you will be deemed a partial qualifier. As a partial qualifier, you may practice and receive an athletics scholarship, but may NOT compete, during your first year of full-time enrollment at an NCAA Division II school.

# DIVISION III AMATEURISM

## CERTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS

**International college-bound student-athletes** (first-year enrollees and transfers) who initially enroll full time at an NCAA **Division III school** on or after Aug. 1, 2023, must have their **amateur status** certified by the NCAA Eligibility Center. (Academic documents may be requested to establish your official graduation timeline for amateurism certification purposes.)

## ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

You must be on a Division III school's **institutional request list** before your certification will be started.

## START YOUR AMATEURISM CERTIFICATION IN THREE EASY STEPS!

1

### CREATE YOUR ACCOUNT

International student-athletes (first-year enrollees and transfers) planning to study and compete at a Division III school are required to complete an **Amateurism-Only Certification account** with the **Eligibility Center**.

2

### ENTER YOUR INFORMATION

When you register for an Amateurism-Only Certification account with the Eligibility Center, you will be asked a series of questions about your **sports participation** to determine your amateur status. In some instances, the Eligibility Center may need to gather additional information to evaluate your amateur status.

### REQUEST YOUR FINAL AMATEURISM CERTIFICATION

You must **request your final amateurism certification** through your Eligibility Center account; the Eligibility Center cannot finalize your amateurism certification without your request. You can request your final amateurism certification even if other tasks are still open in your account. When you can request your final amateurism certification depends on when you are initially enrolling full time at a Division III school:

**Fall Enrollment:** If you are initially enrolling at a Division III school in the fall semester, you may request a final amateurism certification on or after April 1 prior to enrollment.

**Winter/Spring Enrollment:** If you are initially enrolling at a Division III school in the spring semester, you may request a final amateurism certification on or after Oct. 1 prior to enrollment.
